These can be leaves, twigs, stones, toys or any other object that looks interesting. Put them on the table and draw them.</p>
	<p>P.E.</p> <p>Go to the park/ back garden and play a game!. Start with some stretching and warm ups such as jogging on the spot or star jumps then play a game, this could be football, rugby, Frisbee, or a simple game of tag/ stuck in the mud</p>	<p>Geography</p> <p>Draw a map of your local area, and draw onto the map some key local information, such as shops, bus stops, churches and parks, then make a key to show what the pictures represent.</p> <p>Look at:</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvsfr82/articles/zdk46v4</p>	<p>History/ literacy</p> <p>Ask a family member to tell you about their childhood and make a note of important events that shaped their lives, e.g. where did they grow up?
